

- 6. Hosted a sex trafficking webinar for the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indian's Casinos






- Identify and obtain sustainable funding for ROI

- Establishing a Coordinated Community Responds Team (CCRT) for EBCI to address issues around sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.
- 3. Host an event regarding to domestic violence, sexual assault and bring in other organization to collaborate and bounce ideas and approaches to make more effective and efficient decisions.
